Problem 1. (5 points) Find the reduced row echelon form for the matrix

$$\begin{pmatrix} 1 & 1 & 6 & 2 & 9 & 0 \\ 2 & 2 & 2 & 0 & 1 & 0 \\ -3 & -3 & 4 & 2 & 1 & 0 \end{pmatrix}.$$

Problem 2. (5 points) Describe all solutions of the following linear system.

$$x_1 + 2x_3 - 4x_4 + 7x_6 = 5$$

$$x_2 + 3x_3 + 5x_4 + 6x_6 = 2$$

$$x_5 - 9x_6 = 2$$

Problem 3. (5 points) Describe all solutions of $A\mathbf{x} = \mathbf{b}$ in parametric vector form, where

$$A = \begin{pmatrix} 1 & 9 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 1 & 0 & 5 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 1 & -4 \end{pmatrix} \text{ and } \mathbf{b} = \begin{pmatrix} 8 \\ 3 \\ 7 \end{pmatrix}.$$

Problem 4. (5 points) Determine if the vectors

$$\begin{pmatrix} 1 \\ 4 \\ 6 \end{pmatrix}, \begin{pmatrix} 5 \\ 3 \\ 1 \end{pmatrix}, \text{ and } \begin{pmatrix} 2 \\ 4 \\ 0 \end{pmatrix}.$$

are linearly independent.

Determine whether each of the following statements are true or false. No justification is necessary.

Problem 5. (1 point) A system of linear equations never has exactly 6 distinct solutions.

Problem 6. (1 point) Two matrices are row equivalent if they have the same number of rows.

Problem 7. (1 point) An example of a linear combination of the vectors \mathbf{u} and \mathbf{v} is the vector $\frac{1}{2}\mathbf{v}$.

Problem 8. (1 point) The equation $A\mathbf{x} = \mathbf{b}$ is consistent if the augmented matrix $[A\mathbf{b}]$ has a pivot position in every row.

Problem 9. (1 point) If S is a linearly dependent set, then each vector is a linear combination of the other vectors in S .

Problem 10. (5 points) Let A be an $m \times n$ matrix. Show that if A has linearly dependent columns, then $A\mathbf{x} = \mathbf{0}$ has a nontrivial solution.
