- 1. (12 points) For each of the following functions:
 - write down the Maclaurin series using Σ notation, and
 - write down the radius of convergence.

(You do not need to justify your answers.)

(a) e^x

(b) $\sin(x)$

(c) $\cos(x)$

(d) $\tan^{-1}(x)$

2. (10 points) Determine the interval of convergence for the power series

$$\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \frac{(2x-3)^n}{3n}.$$

3. (12 points) The power series

$$f(x) = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} x^n = 1 + x + x^2 + x^3 + x^4 + x^5 + \cdots$$
$$g(x) = \sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \frac{(-1)^n x^n}{n} = -x + \frac{x^2}{2} - \frac{x^3}{3} + \frac{x^4}{4} - \frac{x^5}{5} + \cdots$$

converge for -1 < x < 1 (you don't need to show this). Find the first 4 non-zero terms of the following power series:

(a)
$$f(x) + g(x)$$

(b)
$$f\left(\frac{x^3}{2}\right)$$

(c) g'(x)

(d)
$$\int_0^x g(y) \, dy$$

4. (8 points) Determine the Taylor polynomial of order 3 generated by the function \sqrt{x} at $x = \frac{1}{4}$.

5. (8 points) Find the following:

(a)
$$\lim_{x \to 0} \frac{x - \sin(x)}{x^3 e^x}$$

(b)
$$\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \left(\frac{1}{2}\right)^n$$

(c)
$$\sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{(-1)^n 3^{2n}}{(2n)!}$$

6. (8 points) Use the Taylor polynomial of order 3 generated by $\sqrt{1+x}$ at x = 0 to estimate

$$\int_0^1 \sqrt{1+2x^2} \, dx \; .$$
